SOCIAL ADVANTAGES - The Homemaker club offers sociability and fellowship with other members; it gives a feeling of belonging, a feeling that a person is a part of the community instead of apart from it, a feeling of being useful and needed. It gives a member a sense of safety and status.

Members can have fun together while learning together.

EDUCATIONAL ADVANTAGES - Education is a people-builder. It is a life-long process that is never finished. Homemaker club members keep up-to-date in these rapidly changing times through lessons on all phases of homemaking and family living that are presented by outstanding speakers and specialists.

LEADERSHIP - The Homemaker club provides good training for leadership as one becomes a club officer, project leader and by sharing lessons. This helps each member become a leader in community also. Today's leaders help choose tomorrow.

CITIZENSHIP - A member becomes a better citizen by living up to the principles of the Homemaker club creed, by taking part in club projects, by sharing ideas and through leadership.

WORLD CITIZENSHIP - As members of the Associated County Women of the World (ACWW), homemakers learn a sense of world citizenship through contacts with and from reports on, national and international activities, by sending Pennies for Friendship and by supporting other international projects.

ARTISTIC ADVANTAGES - Lessons and or projects in arts, crafts, home furnishings, interior decoration, landscaping, fashions and personal appearances help club members develop artistically.
